

 - 1995 Oregon terminal added.
 - 1996 Marten celebrates 50 years in business and opens the Roger Marten Community Center in Mondovi, WI.

Marten Dry Hits the Road

More than 200 trailers to be in dry operation by year end

We are pleased to announce that we are officially up and running with our Marten Dry Division. We started the division in January of 2016 with 4 drivers and 12 trailers. We initially planned on starting our Dry Van operations in the March/April time frame, but

changed the start up to January to take advantage of opportunities made available to us from customers bid awards. We started with some of the dry van trailers already in our Marten network and have started adding new trailers. By the end of 2016 we plan to have more than 200 trailers for our dry operation.

The startup has gone very well so far and has already shown to be profitable. Our operations and sales groups have worked extremely hard to implement this new division. The drivers are the backbone of this startup, without their dedication and work ethic we would not be where we are today. These are great driving jobs that allow drivers to stay in certain lanes and maximizes their hours. The drivers are getting great miles and get to be within striking distance of their homes at any given time. Drivers are able to stay at their house sometimes during the week as well as enjoy their 34 at home on the weekends.

As of May 1, 2016 we are operating 20 drivers and 40+ dry van trailers. Currently we are operating out of Kansas City, Dallas, and Chicago metros. Our plans are to expand in these areas as well as St Louis and Indianapolis in the near future. Another

major goal is to start up local work in the metro areas giving drivers the ability to sleep in their beds every night. We could not

do this without a solid customer

base already established with us and newly welcomed customers under the Marten umbrella. We have plans to add Dry Van operations to other Marten facilities within the next year adding to the growing business opportunities at Marten. Dry van is yet another example of developing our infrastructure over the last several years with our Regional/OTR temp control, Dedicated, MRTN

de Mexico, Intermodal, and Brokerage business divisions to move Marten forward and provide solutions for our customers' freight and service needs.


This is an exciting and new venture that sets Marten apart from the rest. We couldn't do this without ALL of the good Marten people working together as a Team.

Marten's Longevity and Success Uncommon

Fleet failures rose sharply across the industry during first quarter of this year

First quarter numbers are out and fleet failures across the country are on the rise! Transport Topics' April 18th edition reviewed how fleet failures rose sharply in the first quarter of 2016. While many fleets have been able to survive during the recent years, they are now finding themselves struggling to stay afloat. In the first quarter there were 3,585 fleet failures, which is about three times more than the first quarter last year! The article sites key reasons for this upturn; most importantly ... supply and demand; with additional trends of fuel, pricing, freight demand and used truck prices also affecting fleet failures.

While future trends remain to be seen, upcoming federal mandates for fleets to install Electronic Onboard Recorders will without a doubt cause more hardships and fleet failures in the coming years. Marten has worked the last five years to implement electronic logs and learn how to manage their effects on productivity. While other companies will struggle to adapt we again are leading the industry.



A million pallets in order weighed, a million checks the tires OK...


A million pot holes someone paved, a million costs to fuel my way...
