DRIVER HONORS

Marten takes pride in announcing the induction of our newest Million Mile and Medallion inductees. This year we inducted numerous Million Mile drivers, as well as our third group of Medallion Club drivers. The Medallion Award honors drivers who do not drive more than 80,000 miles per year but they routinely operate in congested city traffic and are in and out of customer facilities multiple times per day (drivers who are in an Intermodal, Local, and some of the dedicated positions). The criteria for a Bronze Medallion is eight years accident free and a Silver Medallion is 16 years accident free.

On April 6th Marten inducted one 4-Million Mile driver, one 3-Million Mile driver, one Silver Medallion driver, eight 2-Million Mile drivers, forty five 1-Million

Mile drivers and twelve Bronze Medallion drivers into the Million Mile and Medallion Clubs. The



SAFETY

USE THE 3-POINT CONTACT METHOD



Using what's called the three-point contact method when entering and exiting a truck can help to significantly reduce the chance of a serious injury from a slip or fall. This simply means three of four limbs remain in contact with the vehicle at all times (two hands and one foot, or two feet and one hand).

These three points of contact form a triangle of anchor points, which changes in form when mounting or dismounting a vehicle. Drivers have the most stability when the center of the triangle is closest to their center of gravity.

Sideways movement should be avoided since it creates an imbalance of weight distribution. Below are some additional do's and don'ts when exiting and entering trucks:

The **DOS**

- Enter and exit facing the cab.
- Mount and dismount only when equipment is stopped.
- Look for obstacles before exiting the vehicle.
- Break three-point contact only when you reach the ground, cab or platform.
- Take extra care in wet, snowy or icy weather.
- Avoid wearing loose or torn clothing that can catch on equipment.

The **DON'TS**

• Jump off a truck. Doing so exerts 12 times your body weight on your joints when you land.

- Climb down with something in your free hand. Put it on the vehicle floor and reach up for it when you get down on the ground.
- Use tires or wheel hubs as a stepping surface.
- Use the door frame or door edge as a handhold.
- Become an injury statistic.

Simple Ways to Spot and Avoid Skin Cancer

Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in the United States, and cases of melanoma, the most serious form of skin cancer, have been on the rise over the past three decades, according to cancer.gov.

May is National Melanoma/ Skin Cancer Detection and Prevention Month, making this a great time to focus on steps for avoiding skin cancer and identifying it early on, when it is most treatable. People may shrug off skin cancer as sounding less dangerous than cancers affecting other vital organs. But if left untreated, these cancers can spread to other parts of the body, making them difficult to treat and potentially deadly.

The good news is skin cancer is relatively easy to detect through regular self-examinations at home. Screening yourself is as simple as using a mirror to check your skin for new or suspicious moles or spots and monitoring them for changes in color, size or shape over time.

Any signs of possible cancer should be reported to your primary care provider, who can run further tests or refer you to a specialist, if needed.

Want more good news? The best way to avoid developing skin cancer is to practice simple sun safety whenever spending time outdoors.

• Use sunscreen with an SPF

of 15 or more to protect against ultraviolet (UV) radiation

• Apply enough sunscreen to all exposed skin and reapply as necessary to keep from getting burned

• Avoid spending long periods out in the sun, especially between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., when the sun's rays are strongest

• Cover up outdoors by wearing hats, sunglasses, long-sleeved shirts and long pants.
