Congratulations to our Walmart dedicated fleet for being named the Walmart Grocery

Carrier of the year for the second consecutive year! Marten was chosen for this prestigious award out of a competitive list of other transport companies that work delivering Walmart grocery products. Marten was previously awarded in 2015 and 2019.

In 2020, our 6 Walmart Distribution Centers completed a total of 692,945 store deliveries with an on-time delivery rate of 99.74%. Two of

Marten's Distribution Centers were in the top 10 out of all Walmart Distribution Centers, and three more



finished in the top 20. When we took over our 6th

Distribution Center located in Monroe, GA, it was ranked at the bottom but with hard work Marten was able to bring this ranking up to 25th and today that same Distribution Center currently sits in 4th place in a 4 week rolling average! In 2021 Marten is poised to place all 6 in the top 15.

Being the top carrier is no easy task, but ALL our employees have made this possible. With focus, dedication, teamwork and our desire to push ourselves



SAFETY

Some Important Tips for Driving Safely in a Work Zone



Work zones often result in narrow lanes, merging, shifting lanes, slowly and stopping traffic, unexpected work vehicles entering the traffic flow, temporary speed limit changes, flaggers in the roadway, confused drivers and other disruptions. It is crucial for drivers to stay focused and avoid distractions. *Pay attention to road construction signs.

*Adhere to instructions from the flagger.

*Leave enough space between you and the person in front of you to stop safely.

*Take advantage of your driving height and anticipate braking situations.

*Be prepared at all times to slow down or stop suddenly in a work zone.

*Get into the correct lane well in advance of lane closures.

*Be cautious of motorists racing to get ahead of you in merge areas.

*Be aware of your No-Zone areas where crashes are more likely to occur.

*Avoid work zones by using alternate routes when possible.

• **2013** - Grill Guards & Collision Mitigation systems added. Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker visits during Driver Appreciation week.



20 Students Selected for \$3,000 Award *Company has provided \$390,000 in funding for higher education programs*

The Randolph L. Marten Scholarship Program started in 1998 to provide financial assistance to employees dependents who wanted to further their studies and go onto secondary education. To be eligible for the scholarship program, applicants must be a dependent child of a Marten Transport employee who has been with the company for at least a full year, while pursuing secondary education at a college or vocational program. Recipients are chosen by merit by Scholarship America (a non-profit organisation). When the program started in 1998 recipients were awarded \$1,000. The program now awards \$3,000 to each student. To date, Marten has awarded 226 scholarships totallying \$390,000.

Marten previously awarded 15 students annually. This year to honor our 75th anniversary, Marten generously increased it's scholarship award to 20 students.
