A Year to Remember

Marten reflects on 2021 with an eye on the future

We set strong goals for ourselves in 2021. Nearly two years into a global pandemic, the entire Marten team was forced to work harder, act more quickly, and think outside of the box to overcome unprecedented times. Our people have adapted to each new challenge to keep the focus on the continued growth of our business and to take care of each other. These actions led us to be one of the most profitable and sustainable transportation companies in the industry.

As part of the changes implemented this year, Tim Kohl was promoted to Chief Executive Officer and Doug Petit was promoted to President. Both are key players in Marten's success and we are excited about what is to come with them in their new leadership roles.

Marten recognizes drivers are the heart of our company. In 2021 we made dramatic pay changes to show our gratitude to all our drivers. We improved our pay packages in all our divisions. We increased base pay, premium pay, minimum guarantee pay, and our industry-leading inclement weather pay. Our efforts to improve driver pay coincide with our continued focus on improving jobs for our drivers. Each day we strive to create more driver-friendly jobs which leads us to increased home time, life predictability, and job satisfaction. We will continue this trend throughout 2022 and beyond, creating jobs that drivers want.

2021 was also a year of expansion amongst many of our business platforms. RCOFC, the business that utilizes stackable reefer containers saw impressive growth, starting the year with 500 containers and growing to 633. By the end of 2022, we hope to see that number nearly double.

Dedicated added 13 new fleets this year, 9 of which were new customers, totaling 123 new drivers added to the team. Growth within our current fleets also

continued adding 75 drivers to those fleets. This year we were also awarded Chemours Company Titanium Technologies 2020 Platinum Carrier of the Year. A huge thank you, to all our drivers that continue to provide exemplary service for not only Chemours but all of our dedicated fleets!

Our Dry Van Division celebrated its 5th anniversary this year. The division started in 2016 with 3 trucks based out of Edwardsville, KS. Over the years we have expanded to the Southeast and West Coast. We have grown our business organically, operating 300 trucks and servicing over 140 customers. Our 2022 plans include a regional expansion in Desoto where we will service the Southwest. We will also expand the Dry Division into Mexico, joining the Marten De Mexico teams in Laredo and Otay Mesa.

Marten remains an industry leader in solar technology. Energy sustainability and solar initiatives provide Marten with long-term profitability while minimizing our carbon footprint. In 2021 we completed the installation of solar panels on our last solar project at our terminal in Zionsville, IN. Solar will continue to be something we look to expand in the future.

All the changes implemented in 2021 have provided us with great wins, including, year over year records in operating revenue and operating income. All of this helped make 2021 one of the best in company history! This doesn't happen without the hard work and dedication from all our employees. Thank you for an outstanding year - amidst continued challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. Our success and achievements will follow us into 2022 and beyond.

Otay Mesa Terminal Construction Project Update



Construction is moving along on Marten's new facility in Otay Mesa. The anticipated completion date is the end of January 2022. This facility is located in the City of San Diego. Windows have been installed, all the doors have been hung and locked and the HVAC, sprinklers and ductwork have all been completed. This facility will be home to a completely furnished drivers lounge and restrooms including showers for our driver's. Among the amenities there will be an inspection lane that can accommodate minor trailer repairs and an Operations floor.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Randolph L. Marten Scholarships

Marten Transport has established a scholarship program to assist employee's children who plan to pursue post-secondary education programs. Scholarships are offered each year for full-time study at any accredited post-secondary institution of the student's choice.

Eligibility: Applicants must be dependent* children 23 and under, (up to age 24) of full-time Marten Transport Ltd. Employees who have a minimum of one year employment with the company as of the application date. *dependent children are defined as natural and legally adopted children or stepchildren living in the employee's household or primarily supported by the employee.

Applicants must be high school seniors or graduates who plan to enroll or students who are already enrolled in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two-or four-year college, university, or vocational-technical school for the entire upcoming academic year.

Awards: Up to 15 Scholarships of \$3,000 each will be awarded each year. Awards are not renewable, but students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

Inclement Weather Pay Increased



Important Information About Fighting Against Driving Fatigue

It is believed that driver fatigue may be a contributory factor in up to 20% of road accidents, and up to one quarter of fatal and serious accidents. The Federal Motor Carrier's Association defines fatigue as the result of physical or mental exertion that impairs performance. Research has indicated that being awake for 18 hours is comparable to having a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of 0.08 percent, which is legally intoxicated and leaves you at equal risk for a crash. No load is worth risking the life of a driver or others on the road.

Here are some ways to help avoid fatigue. Get enough quality rest each night. Treat sleep apnea with a CPAP machine. Maintain a balanced diet complete with fruits, vegetables, whole grains and protein. Avoid junk foods and foods that cause blood sugar spikes. Drink more water and less soda.

Try more regular exercise, limiting time on social media and building strong relationships are ways to help combat depression. Limit your caffeine intake to avoid jitteriness, increased heart rate or palpitations, high blood pressure, anxiety and insomnia. When caffeine wears off users can feel fatigued. Diabetes can cause fatigue with either high or low blood sugars. When your sugars are high, they remain in the flood stream instead of being used for energy while being low means you may not have enough fuel for energy.

Dehydration can cause increased thirst, headaches, dizziness and fatigue. To avoid this drink more water. Stick to a regular sleep-wake schedule as much as possible. As a reminder never drive fatigued.

The most common causes of fatigue:

- Sleep deprivation
- Sleep apnea
- Poor nutrition
- Depression
- Too much caffeine
- Diabetes
- Dehydration
- Working at night

Winter Driving Reminders

Winter weather is headed our way. Here are reminders for driving in wintery conditions.

- Slow down Most at fault accidents are due to excessive speed. Driving at the speed limit may be legal but is often too fast for snow covered or icy road conditions. DO NOT HURRY.
- Keep a safe following distance Leave plenty of room between your vehicle and the vehicle in front of your truck, and beside your truck.
- Don't travel as part of a pack Find a safe way to get away from the pack and travel alone. The goal being to maximize the distance around your vehicle.
- Don't follow the taillights of the vehicle ahead When the snow is so heavy, visibility is low, seeing the taillights of the vehicle ahead, this means following too closely.
- Keep a safe driving distance back at all times, especially in bad weather. If the leader makes an error, you will too. Trucks can leave the road, and yours could follow the lead truck off the road
- Use good judgment If the weather is severe, get off the road. Find a place to get off the road safely and wait until conditions are safe.
- Don't stop on the shoulder of the road Especially in low visibility situations.
- Braking Some drivers like to use the jake brake in less than perfect weather conditions. Some don't. DO NOT ENGAGE THE JAKE BRAKE ON ICY ROADS. Try to avoid overusing your foot brake, unless the entire unit is absolutely 'straight' on the road. Don't over brake when the entire unit isn't straight, the trailer can slide and spin you out of your position, the truck slows down, and the trailer does not. This is especially true, when the trailer is empty.
- Be certain Be absolutely certain during your pre-check before you leave, that the defroster and heater are working properly. Wipers, wiper motor, lights, esp. brake and taillights, washer fluid is topped up, all brakes are set up and windows and mirrors are completely clean before departure.
- Keep tractor and trailer lights clean Keep everything clean, so you can BE SEEN.
