SAFETY

The Importance of Pre-Trip Inspections

DATE

Your safety and the safety of all other drivers on the road depends on your proper pre-trip inspection. A proper pre-trip inspection should take you between 10 and 20 mins to complete. This inspection is not only on your truck but on everything needed for your trip.

• Do you have paper logs in case your QUALCOMM stops working?

• Do you have all required permits, does your truck have all stickers and license plates and are they legible, fire extinguisher, etc. As far as inspecting your truck and trailer the time and effort you put into this inspection is the most important part of your day.

• Are your tires in good condition, is the tread depth legal, check the air pressure with an air gauge.

• Check to ensure all lights are operational if they are dirty clean them.

• Check your truck for leaks, fuel tanks, brake seals, coolant, oil, etc.

• Check your air lines and pigtails. Are they in good condition?

For trucks pulling containers, it is the driver responsibility to ensure that all four corners of the chassis are locked into the correct position with pins. If they do not have all four pins securely locked we are at risk of the container tipping off the chassis.

• If you can check the load, is it secure, are your axles adjusted right for the weight you are pulling?

• When you are connecting a trailer make sure the fifth wheel is greased and in good condition.

• Make sure the trailer is at the correct height to connect to your truck. Once hooked, make sure you get out and check the connection and then perform a tug test to ensure a secure connection.

• Once you are done with your pre-trip inspection you should be 100 percent confident that the truck and trailer are safe. Ask yourself would you feel comfortable with this truck sharing the road with your loved ones. If not have the issue fixed before you drive.

Last month the FMCSA held a roadside blitz focusing on wheel ends. During this blitz period Marten driver had 24 DOT inspection, 3 (12.5%) of these inspections resulted in Marten trucks being placed out of service. All 3 issues would be caught on a proper pre-trip inspection.

Not only will a pre-trip inspection help ensure you make it to your destination safely it will ensure that you earn more money. When placed out of service you may receive a fine, you will not be able to move the truck until the issue is fixed costing you and the company time and money.



SCHOLARSHIPS

20 Students Selected for \$3,000 Award *Company has provided \$450,000 in funding for higher education programs*

The Randolph L. Marten Scholarship Program started in 1998 to provide financial assistance to employees dependents who wanted to further their studies and go onto secondary education. To be eligible for the Scholarship program applicants must be a dependent child of a Marten Transport employee who has been with the company for at least a full year. Recipients are chosen by merit by Scholarship America a non-profit organisation. When the program started in 1998 recipients were awarded \$1,000 each.
